We are looking for highly motivated candidates with an excellent track record and a strong interest in pursuing an academic career to participate in projects funded by an **ERC Advanced Grant** on Cell Plasticity in Metastatic Colorectal Cancer (**PLASTICAN**).

We will perform well-defined hypothesis driven approaches to characterize the plasticity of both tumor and stromal cells and to develop innovative tools that will allow the functional analysis of distinct cell types in the stroma of primary tumors as well as in the pre-metastatic niche in the liver. Candidate for these positions should have a strong background in tumor biology and immunology and should have experience with mouse models.
